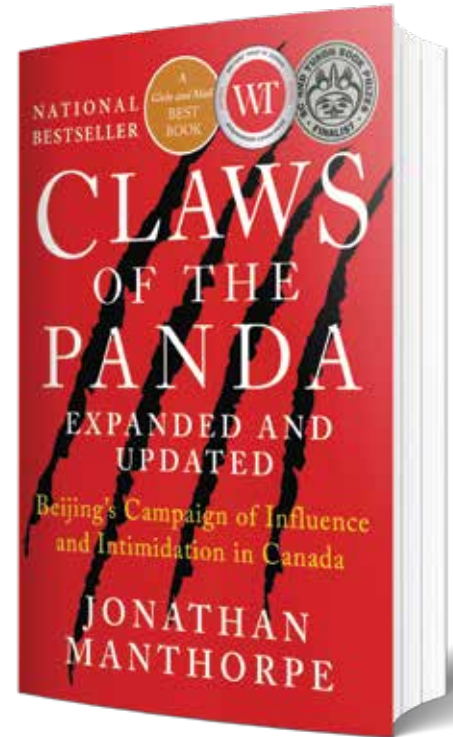

Claws of the Panda tells the story of Canada’s failure to construct a workable policy towards the People’s Republic of China. In particular, the book tells of Ottawa’s failure to recognize and confront the efforts by the Chinese Communist Party to infiltrate and influence Canadian institutions and to exert control over Canadians of Chinese heritage. It shows how Canadian leaders have constantly misjudged the reality of the relationship while the CCP and its agents have benefited from Canadian naivete.

The Expanded and Updated edition of *Claws of the Panda* arrives at a crucial point as Canada’s delusions about its friendly relations with the CCP have fallen apart since the book’s initial publication. This edition sets out to uncover Ottawa’s relationship with Beijing in light of the CCP regime’s increasingly suspicious and belligerent relations with the US and Europe. The age of a distinctly Canadian bilateral relationship with Beijing is over.



Jonathan Manthorpe is the author of four books on international relations, politics, and history, including the national bestseller and *Globe and Mail* Top 100 Books of 2019, *Claws of the Panda: Beijing’s Campaign of Influence and Intimidation in Canada*. 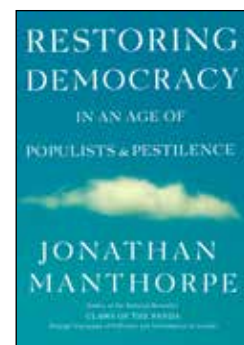

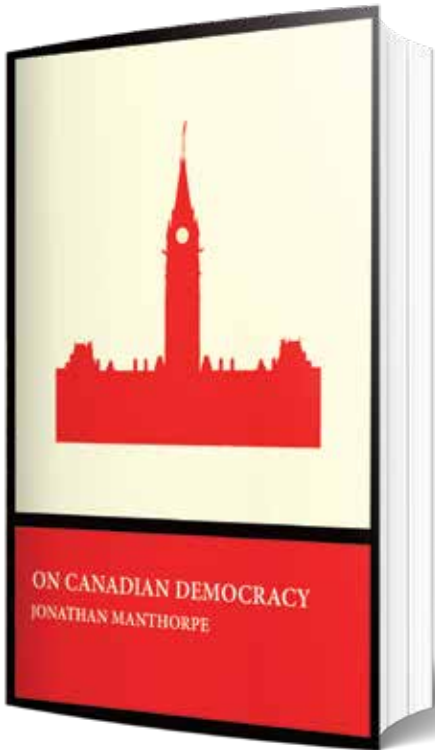

What remains is our current political system — an increasingly dysfunctional democracy.

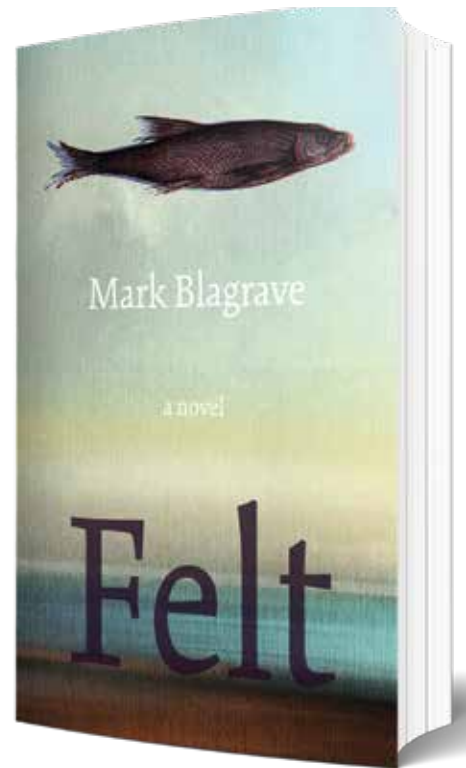

Matthew, a Toronto museum curator, returns home to New Brunswick to his mother who is wrestling with the challenges of living alone at age ninety-six. As mother and son face the prognosis of her developing Alzheimer’s disease, the pair begin to unfold a family saga marked by ingenuity, creativity, and resilience. Matthew pieces together the untold story, spanning three generations and two World Wars, of a Norwegian sardine-packer — his grandmother — who founded a handicraft empire in Loyalist territory. At the same time, his mother rearranges her past, her memory spinning and embroidering family history. A heart-rending and powerful story of three generations of a family in a small Maritime town in which shared and contested memories are woven, unraveled, and rewoven.



Mark Blagrove was born and raised in Ontario, and has lived in New Brunswick most of his life. His first novel, *Silver Salts*, was shortlisted for the 2009 Commonwealth Writers’ Prize for Best First Novel and his novel *Lay Figures* was longlisted for the Dublin Literary Award. He now lives in St. Andrews, New Brunswick.

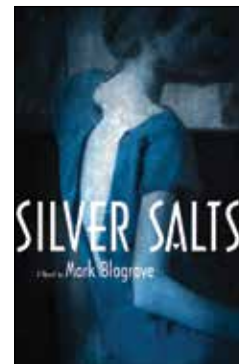

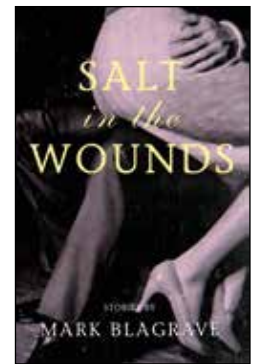

Channel Surfing in the Sea of Happiness is a funny, poignant, and timelessly provocative collection of short stories where misfit characters find themselves adrift in an increasingly absurdist world. These strong-willed characters explore how much of their identities are forged by direct experience, and how much is shaped by constant exposure to the barrage of images imposed on them from elsewhere.

First published in 1998 in a limited edition, these stories, accompanied by three new stories, remain astonishingly relevant. From a story about a precocious teenage boy coming out in high school in the '70s, to a series of tales about two queer con artists and their ridiculous get-rich-quick schemes, to a yarn about a famous transgender sex worker's efforts to rally her community against redneck homophobes, to an account of a lesbian puppeteer's AIDS activism in the 1980s, to a story about a sister coming to terms with her brother's death from AIDS, the collection explores how the human heart stays afloat in a society that is entertaining, informing, and networking itself to death.



Guy Babineau is a writer, freelance journalist, and educator in fashion marketing and communications. His fiction, articles, and reviews have appeared in *The Globe and Mail*, *Descant*, *The Georgia Straight*, *Xtra!*, *Xtra! West*, *Vancouver Magazine*, *The Vancouver Sun*, and more.
